Number and proportion of people who apply their knowledge and/or use sustainable strategies/methods	
<p>Long-term outcome 2: Rights to economic and basic services (SDG 1.4) Short-term outcome 2.1: Marginalized and vulnerable people know their rights and are able to employ the means for pursuing sustainable livelihoods.</p>	
Type	Periodic (periodic assessment over time) with a baseline (if appropriate)
Technical definition	<p>Application of knowledge/strategies/methods: Refers to the ability of project participants to transfer the gained knowledge and/or the learned strategies/methods acquired during project activities into their own life and use it to take informed decisions towards sustainable livelihoods. Depending on the project activities/interventions, the application of the gained knowledge/strategies and methods can be readily applicable (e.g. a hygiene- or agro-ecological practise) or require several months of planning (e.g. action plan for a bee-keeping business). A successful application of gained knowledge and/or strategies/methods learned is characterised by a continuous or replicable action.</p> <p>Sustainable strategies/methods: Each project/programme must come up with its own definition/list of sustainable methods/strategies that it refers to.</p> <p>Children are persons who are 0-14 years old, youths are persons 15-24 years old and adults are persons older than 25 years.</p>
Rationale, good performance, interpretation of results	<i>not defined</i>
Baseline	Number and proportion at the first year of the project / programme phase if appropriate. If not, baseline is 0.
Data collection	<p>Required data <u>Number of people applying knowledge and/or using sustainable strategies/methods.</u></p> <p><u>Proportion of people applying knowledge and/or using sustainable methods:</u> Denominator: Number of people applying knowledge and/or using methods. Nominator: Number of people reached with respective project activities.</p> <p>Data collection tools <i>not defined</i></p>

	<p>Data disaggregation <u>Required:</u> by sex, by age group (children/ youths/ adults) <u>Optional:</u> urban/rural, MaVu/non-MaVu</p> <p>Frequency Timing and frequency depend on the project intervention and its duration. The application should be measured minimum twice during a 4-years programme phase.</p>
Data reporting	<p>Jan/Feb: The local implementing organisation submits the data to the Swiss partner using the latest version of the “Indicator reporting and learning tool”</p>
