Technical definitions	<p>Medical treatment refers to the management and care of a patient to combat disease or disorder. It can include the use of an agent, procedure, or regimen, such as a drug, surgery, or exercise.¹</p> <p>Non-communicable disease (NCD), also known as chronic diseases, tend to be of long duration and are the result of a combination of genetic, physiological, environmental, and behavioral factors. The main types of NCD are cardiovascular diseases, cancers, chronic respiratory diseases, and diabetes. Others include drug-abuse, mental disease, and obesity.</p> <p>Communicable disease (CD) or infectious diseases include malaria, sexual-transmitted disease (STDs) such as HIV/AIDS, leprosy, respiratory diseases such as Tuberculosis (TB) or Covid-19, hepatitis, WASH-related diseases such as diarrhoea or neglected tropical diseases.</p> <p>Children are persons who are 0-14 years old, youths are persons 15-24 years old, and adults are persons older than 25 years.</p>
Rationale	Access to essential treatments for NCDs is generally poor in low- and middle-income countries but could save many lives and increase health and wellbeing of millions of people. Increasing number of treatments for NCDs and CDs indicates better access to and availability of essential treatments and quality primary health care in general.
